

The win elevates Nantwich to 3rd in the table ahead of the weekend's visit of Frickley Athletic. Meanwhile, in an after match apology to Nantwich secretary Bernard Lycett, referee Mr Paul Marsden conceded he made a mistake in changing his original decision of first awarding a corner to Kendal to that of awarding a penalty when in fact his original decision was the correct one in that Tinson's challenge did not impede the Kendal attacker.

Nantwich head coach Steve Davis was not only satisfied with the victory but was particularly pleased with the overall performance when he said:- " We were late in arriving so that meant preparation wasn't up to our normal standard.
